A message from our district Indigenous Education Team

Indigenous Ancestry & Support

'Uy'skweyul! Tansi!

Welcome to a fantastic year of growth and learning. Indigenous education staff work throughout the district to foster inclusive classrooms where every student feels a sense of belonging and experiences academic success.

If your child has Indigenous ancestry - First Nations, Métis or Inuit, (documentation is NOT required) and you would like to self-identify, please see the school secretary for a self-identification form. Each year your child will be funded for and included in Indigenous Education programs. Almost all programs will be delivered in the regular classroom, to ALL students. You will be asked to give permission for any activities offered outside of the regular class. If you have self-identified with the school in previous years, you do NOT need to do a new form each year.

You can opt out of Indigenous Education services at any time by notifying the Indigenous Education staff in person or in writing either at your school or through the district office 250 748 0321 ext 235, or email at ined@sd79.bc.ca

As you may know, in 2017, the Federal Government changed from using the term Aboriginal people to using Indigenous Peoples when referring to First Nations, Métis & Inuit peoples. This change acknowledges the rights of Indigenous Peoples as outlined in the UN Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. https://www.un.org/development/desa/indigenouspeoples/wp-content/uploads/sites/19/2018/11/UNDRIP_E_web.pdf

It will take us some time to transition to the new language so you may see the terms Indigenous and Aboriginal both used.

SafeArrival System: Reporting a Student Absence

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive safely at school each day.

As part of our absence-checking procedures, we use a reporting system called **SafeArrival**. This system helps reduce the time it takes to verify student attendance, make it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

To report your child's absence, use any of these 3 convenient methods:

 Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store or from https://home.schoolmessenger.ca.

The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.

OR:

2. Use the SafeArrival website home.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.

OR:

3. Call the toll-free number **1-833-784-0364** to report an absence using the automated phone system. *Please save this number to your contacts, as it is the number that will contact you, if you did not call in your child's absence. And a notification call is made.*

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future planned absences may also be reported at any time.

Note#1: You must use the email and phone number on file with the school. If you update either of these, you will need to re-register for the system to recognize you.

Note#2: Please save **1-833-784-0364** into your phone contacts, as this will be the number to contact you, if you did not call in your child's absence to the system.

If after trying the three listed absence reporting options above, you are unsuccessful, please contact the school office directly at **[enter number here]** to report an absence.

Notification of Unexplained Absences

The Safe Arrival System will contact parents whose child is absent when an absence was not reported. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up. The system will use the email and phone number(s) provided by you to the school. You will also be notified by the App if you have downloaded and installed it on your phone, and by text message if you chose to enroll.

If you report your child's absence before the attendance cut off using the **SafeArrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will <u>NOT</u> receive notifications. You are only contacted in the case of unexplained absence.




