<u>Attendance Matters - Information for Parents</u>

We all know that attending school is critical to students' success in their classes. But did you know that helping your children attend school does much, much more? By attending school regularly, your children are learning to plan and follow routines, which can help students feel more secure, confident, and competent. Getting into the practice of arriving at school on-time is building lifelong skills. It helps develop good habits that children and teens can use throughout their education, into their careers, and throughout their lives. Making an effort to arrive at school on-time each day improves students' organizational skills. It helps students think about:

- How they can prepare ahead (such as getting organized the night before)
- How important it is to go to bed on time, so they can get up in the morning feeling ready for the day
- Time management paying attention to the clock and planning how long it will take to complete their morning routine

What can parents do?

- Talk to your child about the importance of regular attendance and arriving on time
- Set a reasonable bed time and check to make sure everyone is getting up in time each morning
- Help your child plan to have things ready ahead (such as organizing back packs and lunches the night before)

Our lives get busy and it is sometimes hard to stay on top of everything we have to do. But helping your children learn how to attend school regularly and on time will have positive and lasting benefits.



Winter Gear & Lost and Found



As the temperatures begin to drop, smun'eem and families should begin dressing for the change in weather. Many mornings start off cool and do not warm up until well into the day. Living on the west coast means that smun'eem should dress accordingly and plan for outside lunch recess most days.

Our Lost Found is once again filling up. Please remind your smun'eem to check our box for missing items. Families, please consider helping our learners by writing their names on their clothing tag. At our Winter concert (Dec 18th) we will once again display the Lost and Found for all families to discover what they did not know was lost!



SCHOOL CLOSURES

The closure of schools in the district may occur when we are experiencing severe winter weather conditions, or when it is simply unsafe to drive. Again, it will be determined by approximately 5:45 a.m. whether to close schools in the district after assessing the situation.

Please note:

Schools may also be closed due to weather events after the school day has started. In these situations, parents and guardians will need to make arrangements for their children if buses are unable to operate.

WHERE TO FIND BUS ROUTE AND SCHOOL CANCELLATION NOTIFICATIONS

Any notice of official school closures due to weather will be posted to the district <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u> accounts.

We will notify local radio and TV media outlets prior to 6 a.m. with information regarding bus or route cancellations and school closures. News announcements usually begin after 6 a.m. Media partners will <u>not</u> be notified about individual route changes.

The school district website (<u>www.sd79.bc.ca</u>) will also be updated with a banner informing you of any closures.

In all cases, the safety of students will be the priority. Parents are equally encouraged to keep safety in mind when determining whether to take your child(ren) to school in the event the district is open during winter weather conditions. It is your prerogative to keep them at home if you feel it is the safest choice. When able, students and families should come to the school grounds in suitable winter footwear, use designated walkways, and only park in designated drop off locations.

Let us work together to ensure winter weather days can be safe for everyone.
